Conflict arises from differences in perspectives, needs, and priorities. At QLC, participants come from diverse backgrounds, cultures, and

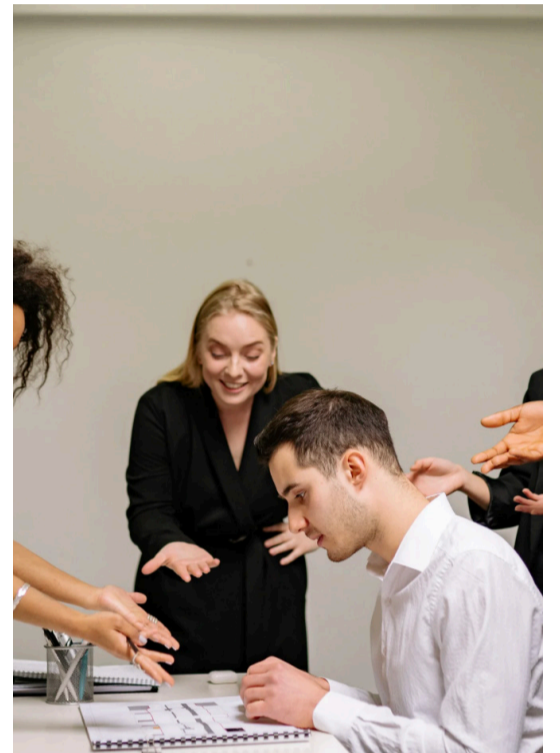

Within the vibrant atmosphere of the Qatar Leadership Conference (QLC), one workshop stood out as a beacon of motivation and personal growth: “Reaching Your Full Potential.” Hosted by the remarkable Muataz Nour, this session delved into the profound impact of positive self-talk and the art of goal setting, igniting the spirits of attendees with insights that can be life-altering. Muataz Nour began his workshop by emphasising the significance of positive self-talk in our daily lives. Drawing upon a wealth of supporting evidence, he delved into the intricate art of nurturing a mindset that focuses on what

we can achieve rather than dwelling on our limitations. The resounding theme that echoed through the room was simple: look on the bright side. With an eloquent and relatable delivery, Nour introduced a series of techniques to the captivated audience, including affirmations, positive self-talk, and the crux of the session – goal setting. He explained that setting goals is akin to having a “compass to guide our lives,” allowing us to navigate our journey with clarity and determination. To drive home the concept of goal setting, Nour employed a vivid metaphor. He asked the audience to envision a finish line and a starting line. These two markers symbolized the transformative role of goals, illustrating how they can

lead us from where we begin to where we aim to be. This simple yet powerful imagery resonated deeply, illustrating how setting goals provides us with a clear path to follow.

Muataz Nour was not content with merely introducing the concept of goal setting; he delved deeper, introducing the audience to the idea of “smart goals.” With clarity and precision, he explained that goals should be Specific, Measurable, Achievable, Relevant, and Time-bound. To illustrate, he contrasted a vague goal such as “I want to be better at math” with a smart goal: “I want to improve my math skills, by the end of the semester, through consistent tutoring and practice, using this tutoring

service and these tests.” This clear distinction showcased how specific, measurable, achievable, relevant, and time-bound goals pave the way for effective personal growth and achievement. In addition to their structuring role, Nour emphasized how SMART goals provide individuals with a clear vision of what they aim to achieve in life. positive mindset, highlighting the significance of using SMART goals as a tool to nurture this mindset. In a world where motivation and direction are often sought, Muataz Nour’s workshop at QLC served as a guiding light on the power of positive self-talk and goal setting. His insights were not only enlightening but also actionable, providing attendees with the tools to embark on a journey towards their full potential. At QLC, it was a reminder that when we shift our perspectives and set clear goals, we unlock the doors to a brighter and more purposeful future.

Ghanim initiated this enlightening workshop with a thought-provoking question: “What is the essence of critical thinking?” This query immediately engaged the audience, compelling them to reflect on the nature and impact of critical thinking. Ghanim proceeded to delve into the intricacies of this concept, offering a profound insight by quoting, “The essence of the independent mind lies not in what it thinks, but in how it thinks.”

In his presentation, Ghanim also emphasized what critical thinking is not. He pointed out that not all quick learners possess the ability to be critical thinkers, elucidating that critical thinking is not merely about thinking quickly but rather about the thought process itself.

He stressed that it extends beyond problem-solving and encompasses a broader spectrum of cognitive skills.

The paramount significance of critical thinking lies in its capacity to enhance our intellectual acumen. However, Ghanim underscored that possessing critical thoughts does not necessarily translate into academic intelligence. Critical thinking equips individuals to interpret any subject matter effectively. It involves the meticulous examination of information, refraining from immediate acceptance, and cultivating our ability to formulate well-reasoned arguments and conclusions.

To illustrate the value of critical thinking, Ghanim shared a personal anecdote from his experience at Georgetown. He recounted a peculiar assignment from his early days as a student,

where his professor presented a writing task with no context: “Is water better for the body than sand?” His friend advised him not to focus on the obvious health benefits of water but rather to deconstruct the components and consider the opposing viewpoint, questioning the reliability of the information.

Ghanim urged the audience to be introspective and identify the areas in which they might lack critical thinking skills. He stressed that being a critical thinker does not guarantee a predetermined outcome, and that not possessing these skills can lead to societal shortcomings. If everyone embraced critical thinking, it could potentially bridge divisions and enable individuals to discern right from wrong. Critical thinking plays a crucial role in multiple facets of life. To cultivate this skill, one must take the role of

a philosopher, wearing the shoes of curiosity and constantly asking “why” and “how.”

Furthermore, Ghanim urged the audience never to underestimate individuals from disadvantaged backgrounds, often referring to those marginalised communities such as the economically disadvantaged or women. He pointed out that critical thinking is frequently overlooked in these situations. He emphasised the importance of verifying the accuracy of information and not taking it for granted, regardless of the source.

We thank Mr. Ghanim for his insightful workshop and have resolved to reflect on our own gaps in critical thinking, and we encourage all our readers to do the same!

Starting off the second day of QLC was what many attendants believe to be one of the best workshops of the conference, led by Awrad Mousa, The Art of Debate: Mastering Persuasion was a fan favourite for those able to attend it. Riddled with group activities and enticing class discussions it allowed everyone to engage with each other with a fascinating range of topics: whether Pineapple does or does not belong on pizza, as well as who reigns supreme waffles or pancakes. Additionally there were a plethora of memorable moments that resonated with the participants that day. From having a gifted young vocalist perform a rendition of rolling in the deep to the speaker herself deciding to play mind games with her participants in the final activities.

What set this workshop apart was the very present sense of comfort and relatability present, a very visible connection made between the speaker and listener. The

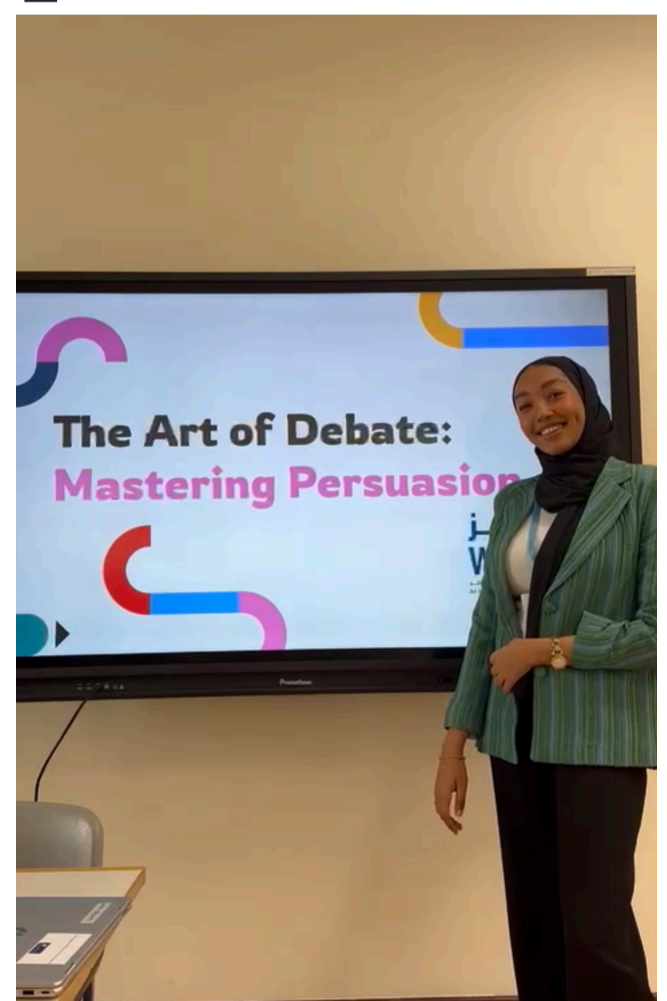
workshop itself was brimming with information going into depth about public speaking, and debating skills. Dare I say, a one size fits all style was developed during the production of this workshop. The Art of Debate helped provide skills and teach many attendees, all in different stages of life and levels of experience, a basic foundation on which to build and fortify their abilities and future experience. To the many students there wishing to take one more and more leadership roles and speak publicly more often, this allowed for an incredible opportunity to dabble within the confines of arguing and its roots; slowly dissecting the larger picture until the points beneath are clearly visible.

One might expect such a topic to overwhelm the average student yet due to the up to date relevant examples presented, this way everyone was able to relate it to personal experience and articulate the

information, finding use to most if not all information presented to them today.

The Art of Persuasion also gave the opportunity to tailor the speaking style to the individual themselves, allowing them to feel more comfortable when ranting or making a point. Moreover, great points such as using emotions to your advantage, in the use of Pathos (alongside ethos and logos), in doing so it broadened the attendees and I likewise horizons.

As unofficial participants I and other press team members were able to be involved in a rapid speed round debate game, honing our ability to think on our feet, rebutting points and developing counter arguments. It was these types of activities that I believe highlighted the best feature of both QLC and this workshop as it allowed for full participation of the entire class, not a singular person not talking to someone new and sharing and discussing their thoughts on the matter or motion presented.
